was founded on 13 April 2018, from the initiative of the Silvia Santagata Research Centre (CSS-EBLA).





After an exciting Summer School (June 2022) on the topic of NaturArchy, where artists, scientists, policymakers, economists, philosophers and more came together to exchange and inquire, all participants had the chance to present a **project proposal** for research and production of an <u>artwork</u> touching on one or more of the many topics of relevance to NaturArchy.

A total of **14 projects have been selected** by a curatorial committee and expert board for further development.

From January to June 2023, **artists will be in residence** at the JRC / EC to further develop their proposal in concomitance with their counterpart scientists/policymakers.

After a second evaluation phase in the Summer 2023, a selection of these proposals for **artworks will be produced** and **exhibited** at Parc du Cinquantenaire,


